BELL TOWER RESTORATION PROJECT

HONORING MILDRED AND ALFRED DAVIS' CONTRIBUTION TO WESTMORE COMMUNITY CHURCHAND THE WESTMORE COMMUNITY

In the summer of 2017, Darryl Davis approached Mark Stevens, Trustee, about a project to open up the bell tower, removing the louvres hiding the bell and replace them with plexiglass. With his crew of Davis Creative Building and Design, Darryl began the work. We believe in the late 1970's or early 1980's, the arches (semi-circle openings) were installed to perhaps protect the interior of the bell tower from the weather. As it progressed, a louvre at the base of the plexiglass was installed to let the music flow from the carillon speakers throughout the Town of Westmore.

As the project was developing, the Church was designated as a State Historic Building and is now on the State Historical register. Repairs of rotten wood on the interior of the tower, the exterior siding and the exterior trim was also completed. The building is a Queen Anne Style and the builders who worked on the church can be linked to the town Westmore. The Bell Tower is now open in all directions and the bell can be seen in the foreground of the lake and mountains. The photos on Page 1 show the before and after changes.

Some interesting history was discovered during the renovation. We know when the church was built but lots of other questions were unanswered. A signed board was discovered in the bell tower. On it two dates were written and the names of the people who worked on the building were listed. They wrote it as follows:

Carpenters and builders of this Church 1894 signed

Welch Webster

Rash Standish Painters – 1919

E. S. Rose O. E. Goss

one other name not legible

In 1954 Alfred and Mildred Davis purchased the Calkins farm. The Calkins insisted that only a family interested in being active in the Westmore Church were to purchase this farm. As history shows, they did buy the farm, raised their 4 children and precious Jersey cows there. Mildred still lives at the farm and her son, Darryl, occupies the barn with his building equipment. Both Alfred and Mildred were dedicated citizens of Westmore and have been members of the church since that date. They worked tirelessly on so many projects in the church and the community, preserving the church, fund raising for it and being a big part of the fellowship in the town.

The Davis Family supported this effort to recognize their parents, Alfred and Mildred Davis contributions to the Westmore Community Church and the Westmore community.

The restoration of the bell tower honors the parents of Darryl, Brenda, JoAnn and Patricia.

TRUSTEES REPORT - Bruce Tanner

The church's grant application to the VT State Division of Historical Preservation for funds to replace the roof was denied in December, 2017. This was a very competitive cycle, with only 17 out of over 40 applications approved. Since then a very generous donor has stepped forward and the Dick Simpson scholarship fund has been released for unrestricted use, thus the planned roof replacement can go forward this June.

The ROW easement deed with Jim and Lisa Myers is nearing completion. As previously agreed with the Myers, we are preparing a quit claim deed on the current ROW deed and have engaged the services of lawyer Sarah Davies Coe for this purpose. Signing and recording of deeds should happen later this month, barring any unforeseen snags, after which negotiations with the Town will move forward on the ROW deed from the Town across the so-called Ministers Settlement Lot, otherwise known as the gravel pit. If all goes as planned, preparations for logging our woodlot should commence later this year with an eye to logging the lot this winter. The goal will be to improve the lot for purposes of sugaring.

There has been some recent discussion about whether or not to host the Westmore Day event this summer and I inquired of the Westmore Association officers if the association would be interested in taking over management, and got a positive response. As of this writing nothing has been decided, but a decision has to happen soon for this to take place. The thought is that the church would still participate, perhaps by providing food and refreshments, while the association manages other aspects. Also, it has been decided to move the Pancake Breakfast from Wednesday, the Fourth, to Saturday, July 7, due primarily to lack of manpower on the Fourth.

Plans are in place to paint the church this summer after the roof job is completed and talking with potential contractors is underway. We will need to do some serious fundraising in the coming days to make this happen.

Plans are also underway for a dedication ceremony of our recently renovated bell tower. The tentative date for this is August 19, 2018, and the event will commemorate the generous donation of funds and labor by the Davis family with installation of a memorial plaque. It is hoped that this event can also serve as a fundraising event to replenish our building maintenance funds.
